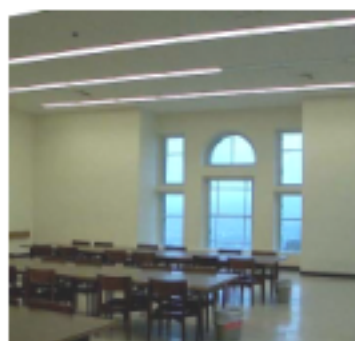


Spotlight on Kinkeldey Room

Looking for a quiet place to study? On January 30th the newly renovated Kinkeldey Room will be open for business! The Kinkeldey Room, opened in 1937 and located on the eighth floor of Uris Library, was named in honor of Professor Otto Kinkeldey, University Librarian from 1930 - 1945.

The room features individual and group study tables in an inspiring space offering spectacular views of Ithaca and Cayuga Lake.



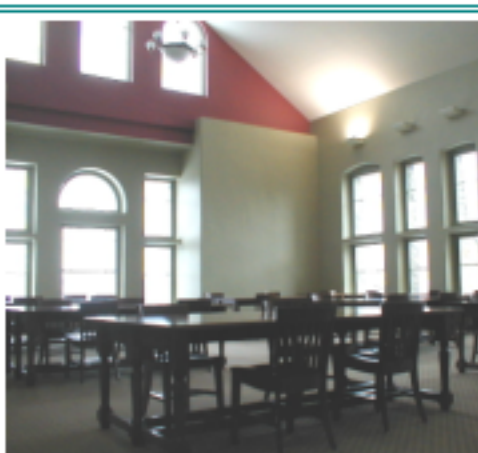
Before renovations

The renovations included the removal of the drop ceiling and fluorescent lighting to accommodate a dramatic vaulted ceiling.

This exposed several windows that were a part of the room's original design, including one overlooking the Dean Room.
